Subject: -Grant of Extension of Conditional Permission to COER Medical College of Ayurveda and Hospital, Post Box No. 27, 7th KM, Rookree-Haridwar Road, Vardhamanpuram, Roorkee-247667, Uttarakhand, (Inst. ID: - AYU0664) with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2023-24 under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder-reg.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made there under shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made there under. Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM Act, 2020 shall not be applicable.

- 1. Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, Hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely to COER Medical College of Ayurveda and Hospital, Post Box No. 27, 7th KM, Rookree-Haridwar Road, Vardhamanpuram, Roorkee-247667, Uttarakhand, (Inst. ID:- AYU0664) inspection of your College was conducted on 22.05.2023 and 23.05.2023 on Hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Asessment and rating Board, NCISM to process the extension of Conditional permission with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2023-24 under Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020.
- 2. Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for undergraduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under.
- 3. Further, three faculties of your institution in the academic year 2022-23 were proven to be physically absent but working only on paper teacher and in accordance with section 28(1)(f) of NCISM Act 2020, regulation 3(1)(f) of RMS, 2016 as per the letter of MARBISM vide letter no 26-75/2021-visitation dated 31/08/2021 and letter no. 3/2022/MARB/General Matter dated 17/08/2022, a penalty of rupees 75 lakh was imposed on your institution as three faculties namely Dr. Ganesh Borade (AYRS00350), Dr. Jayashree Madhukarrao Damke (AYSS00133), Dr. Yogesh Balachandra Mhatre (AYSS01455) were proven to be physically not present but working only on paper teachers and same was communicated to you vide letter no. Teacher Verification/MARB/2022 dated 23.03.2023.
- 4. Further, a reminder letter was sent to you vide letter of even no. dated 28.07.2023 for remittance of the imposed monetary penalty of Rs. 75 Lakh as three of your faculties as mentioned were proven to be physically absent but working only on paper.

- 5. As per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), the assessment report of the academic year 2023-24 was placed in the 54th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 22.08.2023. Board discussed and decided to withhold the permission process till the remittance of the imposed monetary penalty of Rs. 75 lakhs.
- 6. In response of the same you have submitted a letter vide ref. no. CMCAH/RO (3)/1013/2023/1825 dated 04.09.2023 and enclosing a demand draft of Rs. 25 Lakh (Twenty five lakh) in favour of The National Commission fund for Indian System of Medicine through Demand Draft No. 232757 dated 04.09.2023 from Punjab National Bank, and also requesting to allow to pay the monetary penalty of Rs.75 Lakh in respect of appointing faculties physically not present but working only on paper teachers in installments. Further your request was placed in the 57th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM held on 05.09.2023 and Board decided to accept the request of the college to pay the *imposed monetary penalty amount of Rs.* 75 Lakh *in 03 equal installments instead of 06 installments. The 1st installment of Rs.* 25 lakhs have been paid and remaining two (02) installments shall be paid within 04 months of 1st installment or before issuance of permission for the academic session 2024-25 and same was communicated to you vide letter of even no. dated 12.09.2023.
- 7. Therefore, Grant of extension of conditional permission is issued to COER Medical College of Ayurveda and Hospital, Post Box No. 27, 7th KM, Rookree-Haridwar Road, Vardhamanpuram, Roorkee-247667, Uttarakhand, (Inst. ID: - AYU0664) with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2023-24 under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that college is fulfilling the following requirements: -
 - I. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
 - II. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 60 seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2023-24 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
 - III. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatary Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 8. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 9. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
- 10. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 11. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2023 and compliance report should be sent to get permission for the academic session 2024-25:
 - all the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;

- ii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
- iii) all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto; and
- 12. The College administration will ensure that sufficient qualified teachers and non-teaching staff in the college and requisite staff in the hospital, as per the NCISM ACT and relevant regulation thereunder, are in position before the admission of the 4th batch of students in the 1st professional of BAMS is made, under intimation to the Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM.
- 13. The college has to develop the requisite infrastructure for I, II and III professionals well in time as per the norms which will be verified by the medical assessment and rating board and accordingly the permission for taking admissions in subsequent academic session will be considered.
- 14. The college administration may take up the matter for recognition of the qualification under section 35 of the NCISM Act, 2020 at that time when the first batch of students admitted against this course appears for the first final professional examination of the said course.
- 15. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2024-25.
